A Severe High License Law.

Michigan, having refused to adopt a prohibition liquor amendment to the constitution, is considering a more reasonable remedy for the saloon evil. The legislature has just passed a high liceuse and the bill is now just passed a high license and the bill is now in the hands of the governor. It requires that all saloons shall pay at least \$600 license fees a year. Druggists are not only forbidden to seil liquor except upon a written prescription, which must be recorded in a book, but they are not allowed to mix brandy, whisky or other spirituous liquors with soda water without the payment of a license fee. The bill also provides that no screens, partitions, entains, stained glass or other devices, wherewith it is customary to hide a bar from the sight of persons passing hide a bar from the sight of persons passing by on the sidewalk, street or road, shall be allowed. Therefore, if a person wishes to 4.00 PM | Lv drink in a saloon, he must do it in the sight 10:14 PM | Lv drink in a saloon, he must do it in the sight of anybody who has the curiosity to look, no matter whether it be his wife, best girl or a negro bootblack. These provisions are pretty hard indeed.
