

There could be but one guilty party, outside of the frail one who could see one man go to his death—as had already two men before him—for her sake. This is the party—whose name is now withheld—who left Grant county some two weeks before McGinnis' execution. Asked to appear before the prisoner, we are told his refusal was most emphatic; the officer, it is said, acting under McGinnis' instructions compelled him to call on the prisoner, where he with bowed head before the unfortunate felon made no reply when openly accu-ed of having accomreply when openly accu-ed of having accom-panied Lockwood to the jail on the night of July 5th, of murdering him and releasing

the prisoners.

Our informant tells us that within the few d-ys since McGinnis was hanged, public o inion inclines strongly to the belief that this man, who bore in silence the physical and mental shock which alone could have whitened his hair within the brief time when he knew there was no hope between him and the grave, born to his tomb the barden of a crime for which, in another and higher court, neither indictment nor penulty awaits him.-Baker City Reveille.

The Next Census.

It is exemuted that it will require at least 40,000 men to take the census of 1890, and work has already been begun. Census taking and reporting might be said to be an almost continuous work in this country for no somer is one census report compiled tefore the consideration of the next is be-gun. The census of 1890, however, will not be so extensive as that of 1880. The cen sus report of that year included many mat ters that it was afterwards ascertained were not necessary to cover.
