Questions You Must Answer.

Following are the questions which must be answered by those proving up on timber and stone lands under the act of June 3, 1878:

What is your postoffice address, and where do you reside?

What is your occupation?

Are you the identical person who applied to purchase the land on the day of _____, and made the sworn statement assigned by law before the register or receiver on that day?

Are you acquainted with the land above described by personal inspection of each of its smallest legal subdivisions?

When and in what manner was such inspection made?

Is the land occupied; or are there any improvements on it not made by or for the purposes, or which were not made by or do not belong to you?

Is the land fit for cultivation; or would it be fit for cultivation if the timber were removed?

What is the situation of this land, and what is the nature of the soil, and what are there any mines, or indications of deposits of gold, silver, cinnabar, copper or coal on this land? If so state what they are and whether the springs or mineral deposits are valuable.

Is the land more valuable for mineral or other purposes than for the timber or stone thereon, or is it chiefly valuable for either of them?

From what facts do you conclude that the land is chiefly valuable for timber or stone?

What is the estimated market value of the timber on the land?

Have you sold or transferred your claim to this land since making your sworn statement, or have you directly or indirectly made any agreement or contract, in any way or manner, with any person whatsoever, by which the title he may acquire from the government of the United States may inure, in whole or in part, to the benefit of any person except yourself?

Do you make this entry in good faith for the appropriation of the land exclusively to your own use and not for the use or benefit of any other person?

Have any other persons than yourself, or has any firm, corporation or association, any interest in the entry you are now making, or in the land, or in the timber thereon?

Note.—Every person swearing falsely to the above deposition is guilty of perjury and will be punished as provided by law for such offenses. In addition thereto, the money that may be paid for the land, forfeited, and all conveyances of the land or of any right, title or claim thereto, are absolutely null and void as against the United States.
