The Australian System.

A bill, in which the leading features of the Australian system of voting are embodied, has passed both houses of the Missouri Legislature, and is likely to be approved by the Governor. Massachusetts, Indiana and Kentucky have also adopted the Australian system. This law, so far as it affects the Missouri system, is a great improvement of doing away, to a great extent, with the corruption of voters. The practical working of the law seems to be satisfactory. It requires the names of the candidates for office to be printed on a ticket, which is handed the voter at the polls. The voter then steps into an adjoining room and crosses from the ticket the names of the candidates he does not wish to vote for. He is protected in his right to scratch the ticket unobserved by the party benches that usually work around the polls.

How to Advertise the Country.

Some of the newspapers are discussing what is the best way to advertise the country in the eastern states. A very good way is to insert a small advertisement in some of the principal papers of the states where immigration is expected simply saying that information about the country may be had on sending to the board of trade or other agency having immigration matters in charge. They send copies of the local papers for several months to those answering the letters. The weekly record of the papers with such special articles as might be written, would give the very information the immigrant wants. The plan would not cost him if what the ambitious blowing costs, and it would reach vastly more people and give them more accurate information. — Burton Lester.

Water, and Rainfall Chart.

Major T. H. Handberg, United States engineer, has prepared a chart showing the stage of water at the locks of the Cascades from December 15, 1878, up to the present time. It shows a steady and increasing amount of difference between the stage of high water in different years, although the greatest number of years are included between the lines showing from 31 to 31 feet above low water mark.

In June, 1877, the water was 54 feet above low water mark. In July, 1878, it was 56 1/2 feet. In 1885 it only rose 34 feet which was the lowest high water till the present year. The highest stage reached this year was on the 9th of June, when the water was only 24 feet above low water mark.

The chart also contains red rings of the rain gauge showing the monthly rainfall at the Cascades from 1859 to the present time. The largest amount of rainfall in any one month during that period was in January, 1867, when thirty inches fell. In several other years the rainfall was less than ten inches.

A belief is firmly rooted in the minds of our people that artesian water can be secured on the Cascade plain by boring to a depth of from 400 to 600 feet. Centrally located on these plains is the growing town of Hillsboro. Her citizens are willing to expend several hundred dollars in making a practical test. A man familiar with the business, and who is willing to undertake the work at reasonable cost, would find no difficulty in constructing with our citizens for a supply of water, — Independence.

NARROW GAUGE LINES SOLD.

The Southern Pacific Buys the Oregonian System for \$1,500,000.

It is learned from good authority that a sale of the Oregonian Railway Company lines (narrow gauge) has been made to the Southern Pacific Company for about \$1,500,000. This is a consummation which has been wished and expected for some time, and will be a great benefit to the country along the lines of the Oregonian Railway, which has been kept back by the troubles and misfortunes which have hampered the roads and obstructed their usefulness since they were completed.

Shortly after the suit of the Oregonian Railway against the O. R. & N. was decided by the Supreme Court of the United States in favor of the O. R. & N., a liquidator was appointed by the Scottish courts to wind up the affairs of the Oregonian company. This liquidator sent his attorney, Alexander Mackay, out here some time since to examine into the affairs of the company, the condition of the lines, etc., and to take such action as he thought best in the premises.

Mr. Mackay went to San Francisco and talked to Charles F. Crocker about selling the property to the Southern Pacific Company, and was referred by him to C. P. Huntington in New York. Negotiations were carried on there until June 8th Mr. Mackay returned to Scotland, carrying an agreement signed by Mr. Huntington which since his arrival has been approved by the bondholders.

Every one is clamoring for tents, and the transfer companies and tent-makers are working night and day, busily running one lot of tents at night and one in the daytime to accommodate their customers. The tents are gradually filling up, and a busy sight they present. One would think that with such a volume of merchandise scattered everywhere, and tents set up on every side, that the city would be a scene of confusion. But it is not so.
