Therefore the city of Eugene does ordain as follows:

Sec. 1.—That the report of the City Surveyor establishing the aforesaid assessment as the pro rata portion of the aggregate amount that is due by the property holders in the city and the same is hereby adopted as the amount of the assessment that each of the foregoing property holders is required to pay, shall be, and is the amount that shall be and is hereby assessed against the several lots and parts of lots named in said report and in the preamble to this ordinance.

An Arid Region.

The Okecho Review says there is an area of 25,000 square miles in Middle Oregon where scarcity of water retards settlement and cultivation. Of course, it has some fine streams, but as a rule it is an arid region. The soil is usually good and productive when circumstances are favorable. The same is true of a great portion of Eastern Washington, and how to reclaim this desert region and make its fertile soil available is of the greatest importance. Irrigation cannot avail in a region of upland where the streams have cut down through the rocks thousands of feet in places. The thing to do is to try the virtue of artesian wells there. We have an immense inland region which is surrounded with great ranges where a pressure should be felt to bring water to the surface if anywhere. It is literally an interior basin and the surrounding mountains should furnish an abundant supply of excellent water that percolates the veins of lower strata. If boring wells and artesian wells are drilled and water can be raised to the surface by wind mills and stored in reservoirs for use in the dry season, irrigation can be done to a greater or less extent. In the age that is close upon us land is sure to be in such demand that any section favored with good soil will, if possible, be reclaimed by artificial means. What human genius will achieve we can only judge by the past. We have seen wonderful things accomplished and the work of invention has only commenced. The years to come may reveal some process by which arid lands can be made fertile and made to yield largely. There is such an extent of this inland region, especially in Oregon, that human invention and enterprise will be urged to the utmost in hope to effect results and make that region do its part toward sustaining earth's millions.
