

Sunset Cox Dead.

Sunset Cox died in New York, last Tuesday evening, at 8:27 p. m. He was the wisest and most lovable member of Congress, a leading Democrat, and a man of unquestionable ability and integrity.

An Unparalleled Record.

The Chicago Tribune says that the Pacific coast may well claim the distinction of being the largest section of the United States in 1889. The entire losses by large conflagrations in this country since the 1st of January last amount to \$61,305,000.

In these fires the business interests of each of the twelve towns were substantially wiped out. Such a destruction as this is almost unparalleled in the record of fires in the country and opens up a most suggestive field for investigation for the insurance companies.

Good-bye to the Surplus.

The public debt statement for August shows an increase of over \$6,000,000, following an increase of \$1,317,000 in July. During the corresponding two months in each year of the Democratic Administration there was an average decrease of about \$10,000,000.

There is perhaps nothing surprising about this. The Republicans came into power to spend the surplus. With the able assistance of Corporal Tanner, who carried out President Harrison's admonition to "be liberal with the old soldiers" by disbursing \$20,343,000 for pensions during August, they not only made a big hole in the surplus but began an increase in the public debt.

It is not strange that President Harrison is afraid to call an extra session of Congress before the fall elections. To enforce the executive surplus-spenders with legislative surplus-grabbers would give the taxpayers a scare which might stampede even Ohio from the Republican column.

Democratic Ticket.

The Washington Democrats met at Ellensburg this week and nominated the following excellent ticket: Congressman—G. C. Griffiths, of Spokane. Governor—Eugene Semple, of Pierce.

Lieutenant Governor—L. H. Plattor, of Whitman. Secretary of State—Wm Whittlesly, of Jefferson.

Treasurer—M. Kauffman, of Thurston. Auditor—Jno M. Miller, of Pierce. Attorney General—H. Salvey, of Yakima. Superintendent of Public Instruction—J. H. Morgan, of Yakima.

County Assessor Blakely is now at work on the assessment rolls and is assisted by an able corps of copyists. The books will not be completed before next week, but enough has already been done to indicate that the valuation this year will be much above that of last.

A large number of counterfeit greenbacks are in circulation in Portland. They are on different national banks, but are all of the denomination of \$10. None of them are new and clean but are worn and soiled, and many of them are patched, some with pieces of genuine bill, the corresponding pieces of counterfeit bill, of course, patched on a genuine bill. Look out for them they will be brought here.

The dreaded drought, like the proverbial ill-wind, is not without its compensation. The water in the Missouri river at Townsend, Montana, is so low that the river bed is exposed. The people recently began ground-bleaching for placer gold on the river bed, and struck it rich. The first experiment yielded from \$7 to \$10 a day to the man. The Missouri will be lined with gold miners for fifty miles each way from Helena.

A resolution adopted by a peace meeting at Mystic, Conn., declares the Chinese exclusion act to be a violation of the right of all to freedom, and a national disgrace, and a provocation of war, and calls on Congress for its repeal.

A bar of gold, weighing 500 pounds and worth \$100,000, was cast at the U. S. assay office in Helena, on Wednesday. This is the largest lump of the precious metal ever seen since the world began.

In 1887 the Republicans carried fifty counties in Kentucky. At the late election they carried only thirty-three.

Ex-Senator Riddleberger, of Virginia, has taken the stump and declared for the whole Democratic ticket.

Leon Abbott has been nominated for Governor of New Jersey by the Democrats. "Jack the Ripper" has murdered another patient at Whitechapel, London.

The Valley Virginian, a Republican paper printed at Staunton, Virginia, and edited by ex-Congressman Yost, an active Republican, says: "We will not support Mahone for Governor. The body that nominated him was not a Republican convention, representing the sentiments of the State. It was General Mahone's caucus sitting under orders and in accordance with the programme prescribed by the General."
