The St. Helens Mist says: Timber lands in the lower part of Columbia county. Oregon, that could recently have been bought from the government for \$2.50 per acre, are now being sold at from \$20 to \$50 per acre, and many of the owners will not sell for that. This shows to what figures good timber land in Columbia County is reaching, and those who have been fortunate enough to secure a piece have an investment that beats stock in a bank.
