Oregon's Volcanoes.

Joseph Miller says he talked with an old Oregonian, within the past thirty years, who saw Mt. St. Helens in active eruption in 1812. "This old man was at the The Dalles then a Hudson Bay post at the time and said that two inches of ash fell there. And I read on good authority that it is a matter of record that an Indian trading on the Columbia at the mouth of the river at the time of the eruption was treated by an English surgeon of one of the British posts for injuries to his feet from hot lava, that will again prove fatal. Joseph Maek, our first delegate to Congress from Oregon, told me when a little boy that he had seen trees that were badly burned by flowing lava, but still standing. Still, there may be some truth for doubt and speculation in all this; but there is no doubt about the lava, tufa and pumice stone which you encounter at the very outset, when you attempt to ascend any of these snow peaks either in Washington or in Oregon. And indeed, the very graves on the bank of the great river here are often dug in ashes and lava just as on the mountain sides beyond the City of Mexico.
