

There are no prominent landmarks on either side of the entrance and out at sea no opening can be seen where the river emp-ties into the ocean; and this renders navi-gation difficult. The bar is composed of sand without in-dications of rock.

dications of rock.

The river bluff on the right bank is of sand formation, 30 to 40 feet high, resting for the most part on a soft sandstone bed. For about a half mile up stream from Cannery Hill the river bank is a steep sandstone bench which is rapidly di-integrating and falling into the river. Abreat of this bench for some distance the deepest water was found. Just north of Cannery Hill a rock reef extends for some distance into the river, and is of a soft nature.

A slough makes in towards North Point signal station and is believed to have been signal station and is believed to have been of the river. The at one time the bed of the river. The stretch of sand between this slough and the ocean is covered with drift. No indications of rock are visible. Nearly opposite Florence, which is about 4 miles from the entrance, a high range of bare sand dunes extends in a northerly direction between the river and the ocean, becoming gradually lower towards the entrance, where it forms the South Spit.

A tide-gauge, graduated to fect and tenths of a foot, was set at lower end of wharf in front of Hurd and Davenport's store in Florence. The zero mark of this gauge was set Of most every kind, etc. at low tide as given in the United States Coast Survey tide tables for Sinslaw River, zero: Highest high water observed...

BASE LINE.

A base line 1,000 feet long was measured on west side of south spit; from this base were located nine transit stations, and from these were located the signal stations used in locating lines for sounding. For the loca-tion of the high and low water lines points were selected about 200 feet or less apart; these were located by sextant and the lines sketched in between them.

SOUNDINGS, ETC. Two hundred and fifty-one sextant loca tions were made and thirteen hundred and thirty-four soundings were taken in the river and on the bar. They are expressed in feet and reduced to mean low water.

The soundings on the bar were taken from

the deck of the Government steamer Gen-H G. Wright; for those in the river the steamer's small boat was used. For locating the lines along which the soundings were taken two sextants were used and adjacent angles read simultaneously. The sounding were taken with a small three-ply water-hid

Acme, just above the North Fork is a small settlement, with a postoffice, saw-mill, salmon cannery and one or two stores.

Sandstone suitable for jetty construction. was observed, in fine ledges at a distance of 45% to 10 miles from the entrance. The steamer General H. G. Wright, drawing about 7 feet, ascended the river to within 1% miles of the head of tide and encoun-

carried from the entrance to Acme, which is about 7 miles distant; from there to the head of tide the river is narrow and deep, with depths varying from 10 to 20 feet.
I was informed that a surveying party

rendered it impracticable at times, to ran lines for sounding even in the river. The entrance was obscured for days at a time by dense fogs and the signal stations could not be seen.
