Naughty Cincinnati.

An earnest and eloquent Methodist minister, Rev. Dr. Morris, has accepted a call from Philadelphia to Cincinnati. The reverend doctor said he accepted the call solely because he wished to enlarge his sphere of usefulness. There is a suspicion here of something that is not wholly in favor of Cincinnati. Philadelphia is more than twice as large as Cincinnati. It seems as if Dr. Morris had already a large field enough. If mere population is to be counted, he dwells rather than enlarges his field in going to the Ohio city. But perhaps the zealous minister counts by wickedness instead of size. In that case, he must consider the intensity of the wickedness of Cincinnati to be twice as great as that of Philadelphia. If this be true, it is to be hoped the doctor will be able to kindle a great fire of regeneration in that naughty town.

A Blunder and Crime.

Boston Herald: The administration, in interfering to screen Dudley from his punishment for corrupting the ballot box in Indiana, has unquestionably made a bad batch of things. Its effect in that state, according to Republican authority there, will be injurious, and in the nation generally it is simply demoralizing as a piece of party policy. This administration has less political tact than any that we remember for a considerable time. Small wonder that Mr. Blaine holds aloof from actively appearing in its proceedings.

Indian courtship is very simple, says the Walla Walla Journal. The young brave sits back to back with his girl, smokes a pipe and hands it over his shoulder to her, and if her father doesn't keep a cross dog, or is reckless with his feet, the courtship ends successfully in about three weeks. This is much less expensive than feeding a girl on ice cream, fried oysters or caramels; and, as \$2 a night opera is not affected by the Indians, a very successful courtship can be prosecuted for \$1.30. And yet the Indians are called savages.

Corvallis Times: The East Oregonian is evidently opposed to the re-election of Judge Thayer to the Supreme Court. The Jacksonville Times is also opposed to the same gentleman, and it is quite likely that the Democratic party will select a new man for a candidate for the position. It is not at all likely that a Democrat will succeed Judge Thayer, as the Republican party will not favor under the same disadvantage it did when Judge Strahan was elected.

In F. Powers will perhaps be the heaviest loss in Portland by the flood. In addition to nearly 3,000 feet of lumber, which floated off and the greater portion of which was lost, one of his warehouses filled with high priced furniture was shattered against the Morrison street bridge and only a few loads were saved.

Strictly speaking Dolph is as much a Congressman as Hermann, but to give either of them that title is an error. The Congress of the United States consists of a Senate and House of Representatives, the member of one being a Senator and the member of the other being a Representative.
