## THE EUGENE CITY GUARD.

SATURDAY, MARCH 1, 1890. The Oregonian Railway.

Judge Sabin has made a decree in the United States circuit court ordering the sale of the Oregonian Railway Company's line East and West side narrow gauge on foreclosure of mortgage, providing that the certificates issued by the receiver be paid first. The date of the sale will be fixed when the decree is entered, and then the roads and other property of the company will be advertised and sold, and it is to be hoped will fall into the hands of some company which will put the lines in order and operate them as they should be, so that they may become a benefit to the country through which they run, and profitable to the owners.

It was expected that this desirable state of affairs would have been brought about some months since, when the property was sold to the Southern Pacific company, but for some reason, the sale was never consummated. This reason, it is generally understood, was a failure on the part of the Scotch bondholders or stockholders to carry out the sale, according to the terms agreed upon, they thinking that they could by holding off induce the Southern Pacific company to give them more for the property than had been agreed upon. In this way they were misled, and now things have been brought to a focus by the foreclosure of the mortgage on the line.

It is reported that the lines have been damaged by the flood, so it is scarcely probable that under a foreclosure sale the property will bring as much as the Southern Pacific company offered for it. The roads have gone from bad to worse ever since they were leased to Villard, and it may be reasonably supposed that the high water mark of dissatisfaction has been reached and a new and prosperous era is about to dawn.

Pendleton Oregonian, Feb. 21: The street in front of Sherman's hide depot is still thronged with squaws, who visit sheep camps, remove the pelts from the dead animals, bring them to town and dispose of them at a profit. Quite an industry of this sort has been created by the noble red ladies. Most of them transport the pelts to market on ponies, but occasionally some come in on the freight trains from Umatilla and sheep camps down along the Columbia.

Stockmen feel blue over the prospect of several days of winter weather. Some claim that the loss occasioned will be greater than during the previous long cold snap, which stockmen generally were better prepared to face. Now feed is scarce and sheep and cattle are greatly weakened.

The fact that one man's ill luck is another man's fortune is evidenced by the recent snow. The faces of the farmers have shortened in the same ratio as those of the stockmen have lengthened at its appearance.

Garfield Enterprise: It would perhaps be news to know that railroad engineers are paid by the mile for their services. The Northern Pacific pays 4 cents a mile on this division and 40 cents for every hour spent in snow drifts. This latter will go a long way toward explaining the saint like fortitude with which railroad men meet these ordeals which try the souls of the unfortunate passengers.

A \$5 counterfeit treasury note, series of 1890, check letter B, vignette Andrew Jackson, W. S. Rosecrans register, James Hyatt treasurer, has been put in circulation in the Northwest. The paper is poor and thin, and the portrait of Jackson poor and indistinct. In the penalty act on the back the words "legal tender" are in skeleton letters instead of being heavily shaded. It is quite easy of detection.
