Arrested After Ten Years.

Oregoniau, March 2: J. W. Pool, aged Oregonian, March 2: J. W. Pool, aged about 29 years, was recently arrested in Idaho. He is charged with murder, and it is claimed that he committed the orime about ten years ago in Douglas county, Oregon. Poole was brought to this city in custody of William Edwards, daputy sheriff of Ada county, on his way to Roseburg. The prisoner on reaching this city, was taken to the county jail and locked up in the cage occupied by Chee Gong for a long time beoccupied by Chee Gong for a long time before his execution last summer, where a reporter saw him yesterday. Poole was per. fectly willing to talk upon the subject of his alleged crime and arrest, and Jailer James kindly permitted him to undergo an inter-

view in his private office. The prisoner is not a bad looking man, and none would think that at the age of 19 he had already killed his man. He was at tired in an ordinary suit, such as farm hands wear, and his blonde head covered with a cowboy's hat, though there was nothing boyish in his manner. In reply to numerous questions which the reporter asked him, Poole said:

I was arrested a week ago to-day on Wm. Stewart's form in Ada county, Idaho, where I had been at work, for shooting James Mc-Neil, in self-defense, on the 10th of October, 1880. The facts of the case are these: On Eugene National Bank that day McNeil's son and I were in my father's house, on Elk creek, Douglas county, when the elder McNeil came in very PAID UP CAPITAL, \$50,000 angry, and talked roughly to his boy. He then began on me without any apparent cause. I talked back and he came at me with a hatchet, then with a knife, and at last threatened to shoot me with a gun he was carrying. I was so scared that I fled from the premises. I was absent six or seven hours, and, returning to the house, McNeil was still there. In the meantime I had procured a revolver, meaning to use it

As I entered the house the old man spoke to me roughly and made a pass as if to reach for his gun, which was in a further part of the room. I said, "if you get your gun I'll shoot you," McNeil then went down to get his knife, angrily saying, "I'll kill you, you " I wanted no trouble, but he kept coming at me, when I shot him in the leg. I had no intention of killing him, but merely wanted to disable him. However, he died from the effects of the shot.

In one place I found a beautiful little girl with long flaxen hair, and asked the Indian nurse whose child she was. The nurse replied that the little one had been found on a barren island beside the dead body of her mother, who had been killed for witchcraft. Whenever a woman is suspected of consorting with the evil one she is taken to the medicine man. Her feet are tied together and the ligature is then attached to ber hair, and her feet and head are thus drawn together until her tongue and eyes protrude. Ehe is then cast on an island and left to starve.

Imported Seed Wheat.

A car load of Australian white wheat imported especially for seed has been received in Albany by the well known grain merchant, Mr. W. F. Crosby, and it will be distributed among the farmers. The cost of the wheat was considerable, \$1.80 per bushel, but it possesses superior qualities for both fall and spring sowing and will doubtless be sown by farmers.

A well posted wheat dealer on this subject recently said that one great trouble now found is that in grinding valley wheat it has deteriorated so much in the past few years that it requires more of it to make flour, and it is not as strong when made. There is no doubt of the fact that the whole wheat of this valley requires a radical change in order to bring it back to what it was ten years ago. If we keep on as at present, growing the same wheat, in a few years more there will be nothing left for the mill to grind but a thick husk. The flour products will be so weak and poor that we will be unable to find a market for them. It is a serious matter and the farmers should realize at once that they must give it more attention, otherwise they will be the losers. to that extent. Eastern Oregon and Washington have made great strides in improving their wheat during the past few years. It is to be hoped that the valley farmers will take hold of it in the same liberal way. The Australian white wheat has been tried to a limited extent. It is pronounced superior for milling purposes, the grain being harder and the bran is much thinner.
