creased by the application of apparatus for mechanical refrigeration to ships. Our frozen meaf trade with New Zealand is of recent development, and it has already reached enormous proportions. At present PAID UP CAPITAL, ...... \$50,000 twenty-seven steamers and ten sailing vessels, all fitted with mechanical refrigeration machinery, are engaged in this trade. The aggregate tonnage of these twenty-seven ships is 123,000 lons, or an average tonnage of about 4,500 tons, while that of the sailing ships is 10,000 tons, or an average of 1,000 tons each. It will thus be seen that thirty-seven vessels are engaged in this trade of 133,000 total carrying capacity. The total frozen meat cargo which these vessels can carry in a single year amounts to the enormons number of 2,250,000 carcasses, which certainly gives some idea of the great importance of this trade. It is estimated that not more than 1,500,000 carcasses will SPECIAL be available for the trade this year, so that the carrying capacity is more than sufficient for the present volume of trade. - Steamship.

It is said that nine-tenths, of all the oil of peppermint used in the world comes from one little county in New York state. Wayne county is a small county, but it is one of the leading in point of agriculture in the great Empire State. One branch of agrieniture is that of raising peppermint. Two crops of peppermint are raised on a field. The sets, or parts of old plants are planted in April and May, in rows two feet apart. They grow to the height of two feet. If the leaf is pressed, the odor is very profuse. The gathering season is in August, and the plants are cut close to the roots with a scythe. They are cured by wilting in the sun like hay for about twelve hours, the oil being expressed more freely than if fresh. From the roots the next year's crop springs.

The superintendent of the state prison in his quarterly report shows 320 convicts in that institution at the close of the quarter. as against 313 last quarter.
