Information about the Ozar.

The Ozar is said by an old contractor to be an illiterate man, writing a school boy hand and strewing his manuscript with mistakes in spelling and grammar. He chiefly resides at the chateau of Gatschina, chiefly because the hour's distance of that splendid palace from St. Petersburg gives him a sense of comparative security from assassination. The few and simple precautions it is thought necessary to take in this calm retreat are these: The whole domain, including the palace, gardens, park and forest, is surrounded by a high wall, which is again guarded by an entrenched camp. The hundreds of sentries on the wall, many miles in extent, are changed every hour. Every road and footpath is patrolled incessantly, and no one is allowed to leave or enter the railroad station or approach the chateau without pass. Last of all the chief police guard every corner of the palace at least twice a day. After this free and easy existence of happy confidence in his subjects, it is not to be wondered at that the Emperor deems the dismal precincts of the Hermitage or the Winter Palace.

British Refrigerating Ships.

Our food supply has been largely increased by the application of apparatus for mechanical refrigeration to ships. Our frozen-meat trade with New Zealand is of recent enormous proportions. At present twenty-seven steamers and ten sailing vessels, all fitted with mechanical refrigeration machinery, are engaged in this trade. The aggregate tonnage of these twenty-seven ships is 123,000 tons, or an average tonnage of about 4,500 tons, while that of the sailing ships is 10,000 tons, or an average of thirty-seven vessels are engaged in this trade of 123,000 total carrying capacity. The total frozen meat cargo which these vessels can carry in a single year amounts to the enormous number of 2,250,000 carcasses, which certainly gives some idea of the great importance of this trade. It is estimated that not more than 1,500,000 carcasses will be available for the trade this year, so that the carrying capacity is more than sufficient for the present volume of trade.—Steamship.

It is said that nine-tenths of all the oil of peppermint used in the world comes from one little county in New York state, Wayne county is a small county, but it is one of the leading in point of agriculture in the great Empire State. One branch of agriculture is that of raising peppermint. Two crops of peppermint are raised on a field. The sets, or parts of old plants are planted in April and May, in rows two feet apart. They grow to the height of two feet. If the leaf is pressed, the odor is very profuse. The gathering season is in August, and the plants are cut close to the roots with a scythe. They are cured by wilting in the sun like hay for about twelve hours, the oil being expressed more freely than if fresh. From the roots the next year's crop springs.
