An Iowa legislator has introduced a bill, which, if it becomes a law, will not make the "insanity dodge" so popular a plea in criminal cases in the future as it has been in the past. The bill provides that in all cases where insanity is the plea and the jury is satisfied, they shall return the verdict, "guilty but insane." The court shall thereupon order the insane person committed to the insane department of the penitentiary, there to be confined for the term prescribed by law for the commission of the crime of which he was found guilty or until he becomes sane.

"Unless all signs fail," says the Logger, the Skegitt valley will be visited by an unusually high freshet the coming June. The drying supervisors should see that their levees are in order, and that weak places are strengthened, and low places raised, in order to stand the heavy pressure of water. Repairs should be made now, in order that the earth may settle and become compact. Do not delay this important matter until the flood is here.

The Union party have put in the field the following state ticket: For Congress, Major J. A. Bruce, of Benton county; for governor, left in the hands of the Executive Committee; for secretary of state, Nathan Pierce, of Umatilla county; for state treasurer, E. P. Walker, of Jackson county; superintendent of public instruction, T. C. Jory, of Marion county; state printer, J. A. Power, of Multnomah county; supreme judge, left in the hands of the Executive Committee.

While making the arrest of a burly half-breed, an ex-convict, Marshal Robinson, of Walla Walla came near losing his life recently. The half-breed suddenly pulled a knife while he was being escorted along the street to jail and made a thrust at the marshal, who happened to be quick enough to parry it and knock the fellow down with a club. But for the marshal's quickness, the keen sharp blade would have been buried in his breast.

W. B. Blanchard & Co., of Brownsville, have run a tunnel 100 feet at right angles with the Emma mine, up the Calapooia, and expect to cut their lead within the next ten feet. The depth attained by this tunnel will be about 100 feet. Ore from the surface of this claim assayed \$75, and the owners are expecting some rich ore at the depth of 100 feet from the surface.

Five years ago the Spokane Review was a weekly newspaper. To-day the Review newspaper is easily worth \$100,000, and the proprietors would perhaps refuse that amount for it. In addition to this the proprietors of the Review purchased a building site less than a year ago for \$30,000, and this ground would now doubtless be considered cheap at \$90,000.

A light wood clip is expected both in Oregon and Washington this spring. The hard winter has not only proved disastrous to the carcass but to the fleece as well. Dispatches from Red Bluff are to the effect that 70 per cent of the spring lambs have been lost, and that losses of old sheep have been almost as heavy. The wool crop in that section will not be much more than one-third the usual amount.
