 A Matilda County Tragedy.

A Pendleton dispatch of May 19th says: Joe Genevieve, aged 17 years, an adopted son of Chas. Genevieve, a well known stockman, was killed this morning twenty miles southwest of here by being stabbed to death with a pair of sheep shears in the hands of a sheep herder. The name of the murderer is not yet known. It is said the boy and his mother had got the sheep herder into a corner of the fence and were beating him and cursing, while the father stood by and exclaimed, "Kill him, kill him." The herder finally freed himself, reached up to the top rail where a pair of sheep shears lay, grabbed them and fatally stabbed the boy. He then turned on the woman, inflicting several severe wounds. Mr. Genevieve escaped unhurt.

**HYPPOBOMBS**—Saturday evening a foot race took place at Gervais between a young fellow named Cameron and Grimm. After the race was run those who best thought it was a preconcerted affair and at once went after the principals in a rough manner. A rope was arranged to hang one man and a severe thumping was given to another. A rough and tumble fight took place which will result in a big law suit. The scene was an exciting one.—Statesman

The stock inspector has inspected the sheep in the market-stern part of the county, and finds that the loss of sheep in that part of the county out of a little over 100,000 head was 31,000. Wool growers who have commenced shearing complain of extremely light wool. Sheep that last year sheared eight pounds, this spring gave fleeces weighing five pounds. The decrease in the weight is attributed to the severe winter. With the heavy losses during the past winter and the light shearing this spring, sheep raisers will be left in a bad condition.—Prinsville Review.
