An Indian Tragedy.
 "Several Indians came to the city to-day," says the Dalles Times-Mountaineer of June 30, "with letters to our executive officers from Agent Luckey of the Warm Springs Indian reservation, informing them that a tragedy had been committed on Rock creek in Gilliam county, in the killing of a medicine man by the name of Heig-Kneugh. The Indians who committed the deed are Tullip-soose, Schim in-schiet, Wile and Skinoyok. The Indians went to Sheriff Gates, and informed him that the throat of the medicine man was cut from ear to ear, but afterwards, in conversation with Col. Lang, a girl who claims to be the grand daughter of the murdered Indian said he was choked to death; because the Indians thought he had whiskey and wanted some. From Agent Luckey's letter it is very evident that murder had been committed; but from the contradictory testimony of the Indians, it is very difficult to ascertain the manner of his commission. It would be the proper thing for the authorities to investigate the matter, and punish the culprits if found.

Sold Her Pappose.
 The other day in Boise City a squaw got tired of her pappose and sold it to a Chinese woman for five dollars. The China dame scrubbed the little Indian, shaved his head on top, and dressed him in Chinese style and carried him with a blaring red cap which made him glimmer in the distance like the first of summer. Both the Indians and the Chinese got mad over the transaction, and race prejudice looked at the "Chinadee" pappose with glares of strongest aversion. The Indians got their heads banded and shouting, "The man is a white!" She put him in Chinese in Chinese camp!" and the Chinese retorted, "Pappose allee same monkey!" The trouble ended peacefully, the father taking the child, and the China woman merely bewailing the loss of her fifteen dollars.

A Valuable Tree.
 Lebanon Express: The finest cherry tree in the state, so far as seen or heard from, stands in the yard of Recorder Peterson, Lebanon, Oregon. The body of the tree measured about six feet in diameter; the height of the tree is about thirty feet and its branches, which are thickly set and interwoven, have a diameter of sixty feet. This giant old cherry supports no barren or ornamental members, but every inch seems to exist for the sole purpose of fruiting. Its annual yield approximates thirty bushels. 
