Europe and the Farmers. New York World. Count Kalmoky, the Austro-Hungarian Premier, has definitely announced that the European powers will take concerted retaliatory action against the United States if the McKinley Bill shall become a law.

The concerted action of the European powers will be against the farmer. Discriminating and even prohibitory taxes against American agricultural products are being levied. That it is possible for Europe to stimulate the production of rival staples was shown during the war by the great increase in the cotton-growing industry of Egypt, and it has been demonstrated more recently by the important advance made in Hungary, Russia and the Argentine Republic in wheat-growing.
