Consumption.

This fell disease has followed the English-speaking race wherever it has gone. Absent for a century after the first settlement of this country, says the Philadelphia Press, it appeared here as it has in every other colony of the English race, and its ravages only ceased when it had reached those open to its assault. In ten years, ending in 1855, 26,180 persons died of it in Philadelphia, and its yearly deaths in the country reach 125,000. The larger proportion of these are men—the solitary advantage civilized man obtains from the forest, springing from the necessity it lays on her bringing with the tips of her lungs and keeping these nests of the disease well aerated. Hospitals already exist in Germany and England for the cure of consumption. One is needed here.

A Dr. Burt, in Chicago, claims to have discovered a cure for consumption. It is that excessive eating and the excessive use of water will give life to the system and tissues demanded in consumption. He pronounces the bacteria system to be pure nonsense. His treatment consists of the free use of water every hour in the day, nine hours' mountain air. Above all, the patient must look on the drinking of water as his life. Heredity was the great danger, and Dr. Burt advocates the passing by congress of a law forbidding the marriage of consumptives. With this in force, one hundred years from now consumption would not exist in the United States.

Silver Bullion.

WASHINGTON, July 29.—Silverware dealers here and in the south have been notified by the manufacturers that prices have been increased 15 per cent., owing to the rise in silver bullion, occasioned by the adoption of the silver bill; also that a still greater increase in prices is anticipated, and have been advised to give no orders for future delivery. It is stated at the treasury department that the price of silver bullion is expected to go to \$1.15 per ounce within a few weeks. The purity for silver bullion is also 129.29, and it was stated during the discussion of the silver bill that if there should be absolute free coinage, bullion would reach that purity within ninety days. After the measure became a law, purchasers of silverware are all paying 15 per cent more than they were paying thirty days since.
