

No More Special Appropriations.

A decision has been rendered by Judge Boise in the circuit court of Yamhill county that will effectively dispose of future jobs in the legislature for appropriations for wagon roads and bridges throughout the state.

As will be remembered, several appropriations were made by the last legislature, aggregating the amount above mentioned for the building of wagon roads in mountainous districts of the state in Lake and Klamath counties, in the Coast Range country, in Tillamook and other points.

State Board of Trade.

Delegates from the different Boards of Trade of the towns of Oregon met in Portland Saturday and organized a State Board of Trade. The organizations of the following places were represented: Portland, Salem, Astoria, Albany, Roseburg, Eugene, Pendleton, Oregon City, McMinnville, Baker City, Grants Pass, Corvallis, Independence, La Grande, Hillsboro, The Dalles, Monmouth, Venona, Coquille Valley, Marshfield, Dallas, Yacuin, Toledo and Brownsville.

The objects of the State Board are: "In order to promote efficiency and extend the usefulness of the various boards of trade, chambers of commerce and other bodies organized for general commercial purposes in the state of Oregon; in order to secure unity and harmony of action in reference to commercial usages, customs and laws, and especially in order to secure proper consideration pertaining to financial, commercial, mining, manufacturing and general industrial interests of the said state.

The strange indisposition of the advocates of the McKinley Bill to discuss its provisions, which has checked its conduct, of the majority in Congress this year, manifests itself elsewhere as well. The Reform Club of New York City has been endeavoring to bring about joint debates on the subject at the county fairs and elsewhere, and it has had extraordinary difficulty in inducing the Republicans to accept its invitations.

The West: Among the curious facts brought to light by a study of the schedule times of our tri-weekly mail to Eugene, is that it benefits no one. A letter sent from Eugene on Monday, the writer cannot receive a reply until Friday. This is just as it was before the additional trip was arranged.

The tariff bill passed the Senate Tuesday by a vote of 33 to 27. Three Republican senators, Pettigrew, Padlock and Plumb, voted against the bill.

Tillamook can claim, without much fear of contradiction, the honor of being less encumbered with mortgages than any other county in the state, if not on the coast, there being less than 400 mortgages recorded in the county clerk's office during the past ten years.—Headlight.

The A O U W of the jurisdiction of Oregon report three deaths and one assessment for the month of October. Two beneficiaries are paid from surplus funds.

The census report agitation failed to produce the desired result. The department at Washington concluded the census was good enough.

Congress adjourned at 5 o'clock Wednesday evening. The President signed the tariff bill at 9:25 p. m.
