THE EUGENE CITY GUARD.

 Pocket Electoral Vote.
 Wyoming, which has just elected a Legis-
 lature that is to send two more Republican
 Senators to Washington, has a total popula-
 tion of 60,222, which is much less than that
 of West Philadelphia and about one-third of
 the population required to elect a single
 Representative in Congress in Pennsylvania.
 Yet Wyoming will have three electoral votes.
 Idaho is another of these new pocket
 states, with a population even less than that
 of Wyoming—60,125. It also will have
 three electoral votes. The two together, with
 an aggregate population of 120,347, will
 offset the Presidential vote of Connecticut,
 with a population of 732,593.
 The other new states are not so absurdly
 small and have some possibilities of growth,
 but the whole six together have now but
 three-fourths the population of Philadel-
 phia, and yet they not only will have as
 many or more Representatives, but will have
 twelve Senators and eighteen electoral votes.
 The aggregate population of the six new
 states is 750,724, or but a trifle more than
 that of Connecticut, yet they will have eight-
 teen electoral votes to Connecticut's six.
 New Jersey has twice the population of all
 these states together and yet they will have
 just twice the weight of New Jersey in the
 Presidential election.
 The bogus states were created for the pur-
 pose of securing Republican control
 of the Senate and making it easier for a
 minority to elect the President. The first
 part of the scheme has succeeded.
 The Boise City Statesman is happy. It
 announces in big headlines: "Wyoming Re-
 publican by 2,000 majority—Mormons vote
 solid for the Republican ticket." We have
 been reading the Statesman for several years
 and during all that time it has condemned
 the Democratic party because it claimed it
 was the party the Mormons supported. We
 are now glad to hear that the Mormons are
 voting the Republican ticket, and look for
 the Statesman's condemnation thereof in the
 near future.—East Oregonian.
