Robbing Peter to Pay Paul. The salmon fishers of this state are in hard luck. Besides imposing a heavy duty on tin, the McKinley bill gouges them on nets. Their foreign markets are falling away and the business was bad enough off before McKinley packed the tin trust and the net trust on their backs. The Oregon-

the net trust on their backs. The Oregonian of Sept. 22, said:

The fishermen are considerably interested in the McKinley bill, which, if it passes, will greatly increase the price of their nets. W. J. Honeyman has spent much time and money in corresponding with, and telegraphing to the delegation in congress in regard to the matter, and they have used their best endeavors to have the law amended for the benefit of our fishermen, but without for the benefit of our fishermen, but without success If the law passes as it now is, will make salmon nets very expensive.

The statement having been made that the Willamette Valley & Coast railroad had offset their tax levy in Linn county, by pleading a mortgage, given to secure bonds, as indebted-edness and thus wiping out the entire levy, the facts of the case are given. The legislature passed an act expempting the road from taxation for twenty years. The Liun county court, when the matter was brought to their attention, decided that even if the claim was not a valid one—which can only be ascertained from the supreme court decision—that was not a valid one—which can only be ascer tained from the supreme court decision—that having to pay the full amount of state tax up-on the assessment without getting any returns was not good policy, and therefore ordered the assessment canceled, and the railroad gains the simple force of the act to exempt it from taxa-tion. The law is upon the statute books and is in force until it is declared unconstitutional.

Mr. Perry Hinkle, who has the contract for farnishing rock for the jetty at the mouth of the Columbia, fired off a heavy blast in his quarry near Washougal on Friday of last week. A tunnel had been run back into the bluff, which is of solid rock forty to fifty feet binfi, which is of solid fock forty to firly feet in height, and a cross cut made, into which 1300 kegs of blasting powder of twenty-five pounds each were placed, making a total of 32,500 pounds. Major T. H. Handbury. United States engineer, who was present when the blast was touched off, says it was a grand success. There was no loud report, but the whole bluff was thrown out, and at least 50,000 tons of tock rolled down. Mr. Hinkle will shortly ron in a tunnel seventy feet and make a still heavier blast.

Sam French, one of Grant county's wealthiest and most respected citizens, was killed Saturday evening by his team running away and hurling him violently to the ground. Mr. French was on his way home from Prairie City, and when within about five miles of John Day City, it is supposed that his team became trightened and ran away with the above result. His remains were discovered Saturday evening lying by the roadside by the Baker City stage driver. His body was horribly mangled, the skull being crushed and one of his legs broken. The deceased was an old pioneer of Grant county and was well known all over Eastern Oregon. all over Eastern Oregon.
