Marriages that are Void.

A number of papers throughout the state
have recently said that in their respective
counties a number of marriage ceremonies
that had been solemnized were void, on ac-
count of the failure of the persons perform-
ing such ceremony to file the required cer-
tificate with the county clerk. Such, how-
ever, is not the case. A marriage in this state
solemnized before any authorized officer or
minister is not "void" because the
certificate was not filed with the county
clerk within the time prescribed by law,
or within any other time. The pen-
alty falls upon the officer or minister who
performs the marriage, and the married par-
ties need feel no alarm about the matter. Only those
marriages are void which are prohibited by
law, because of consanguinity between the
parties, or on account of either having a
former wife or husband then living, or on
account of either of them being of one-fourth
or more of negro blood, if solemnized within
this state.—E.

Pioneer Press New York special says:

The annual report of the Northern Pacific,
to be presented at the annual meeting of the
stockholders on October 31, is said to make
an splendid showing. The company has in
its treasury \$3,000,000, the earnings accumu-
lated during the past five years, and most
of this amount will ultimately be paid to
preferred stockholders. The proxy com-
mittee for this year consists of Charles L. Colby,
B. Wright and Thomas F. Oakes. The Ta-
coma Land Company has arranged to give
entrance into that city to all railroad con-
verging at that point, and President Wright
has approved of the sale of thirty-five acres
of land for terminals of Tacoma to the Union
Pacific.

In Australia all railroads and telegraphs

are owned and operated by the state, not
with a view to making money, but to render
the cheapest and most efficient service
to the people; one cent per mile being the
cost of passenger travel; all the street rail-
roads are owned and worked by municipal
governments for the same purpose; all land
titles are registered and guaranteed by the
state, so that the owner of a house and lot
could sell or mortgage it in five minutes by
paying a fee of five or ten cents in lieu of
legal expenses, thereby dispensing with
many lawyers.

Yankee Republican: There seems to be a

general belief that when Mr. Hoag returns
from New York new and favorable develop-
ments in the railroad situation will take place.
The impression prevails that the Oregon Pa-
cific Company has made arrangements for all
the money it will require to push the eastward
extension of the road.

In Polk county H. Plummer's seven acres

of hops turned out 10,000 pounds; the eight
acres of John Groves yielded 13,000 pound,
and from eleven acres Joda Morrison took
20,000 pounds.
