**Farmers' Alliance.**  
The following was adopted by the Farmers' Alliance convention at Ocala, Fla., Dec. 9, as amendments to the financial policy:  
First—Abolition of national banks; establishment of sub-treasuries in the several states to loan money direct to the people at a rate not to exceed 2 per cent. per annum on non-perishable farm products and real estate, with a proper limitation upon the quantity of land and amount of money; that the amount of the circulating medium be speedily increased to not less than \$50 per capita.  
Second—Congress shall pass laws to effectually prevent the dealing in futures on all agricultural and mechanical productions, preserving a stringent system of procedure in trials to secure the conviction of offenders, and such penalties as shall secure the most perfect compliance with the law.  
Third—Condemn the silver bill recently passed, and demands free and unlimited coinage of silver.  
Fourth—Demands the passage of laws prohibiting the alien ownership of land, and that congress take prompt action to devise some plan to obtain all lands now owned by aliens and foreign syndicates, and that all lands held by railroads and other corporations in excess of what is actually needed by them be reclaimed and held for actual settlers only.  
Fifth—Believing in the doctrine of equal rights to all and special privileges to none, we demand that our national legislation be so framed in the future as not to build up one industry at the expense of another. We further demand the removal of the existing heavy tariff from the necessities of life that the poor of our land must have. We further demand a just and equitable system of graduated taxation on incomes. We believe the money of the country should be kept as much as possible in the hands of our people, and demand that all national and state revenues be limited to the necessary expenses of the government, economically and honestly administered.  
Sixth—We demand the most rigid, honest and just state and national control and supervision of the means of public communication and transportation, and if this does not remove the abuses now existing, we demand the government ownership of such means of communication and transportation.  
**A Thrifty Government.**  
A recent Berlin dispatch: The manufacture of Koch's lymph is not a scheme of charity with the Prussian government. Although such has been the common impression, the Prussian government intends to make a very handsome revenue out of the secret, and its profits will rival after a time those of the famous patent medicine vendors of Great Britain and America. The state expects to net a yearly profit of 4,000,000 marks out of the business, and of this Koch is to receive a sum not exceeding 1,000,000 marks, and his assistants 250,000 marks each. The lucky assistants are Professor Phul and Dr. Libbertz. The financial arrangements are subject to the approval of the Prussian diet but this no doubt will be recorded. Koch has just returned from a fortnight's holiday in the Harz mountains. He is in excellent health and spirits, and has recovered from a slight depression caused by hard work. To an English doctor, who begged him in the interests of humanity to publish the details of his discovery, Koch said that the discovery was his own and he could do what he pleased with it, that he had confided it to the state and would abide by the decision of the state. A singular case is reported from Lugano, Switzerland, of a Frenchman sick with tuberculosis, who was advised to try the Koch remedy. He replied: "Nothing Prussian, nothing Prussian!" apparently preferring death to the use of the German cure.
