Second - Congress shall pass laws to effectually prevent the dealing in futures on all agricultural and mechanical productions, preserving a stringent system of procedure in trials to secure the conviction of offenders, and such penalties as shall secure the

most perfect compliance with the law.

Third-Condemns the silver bill recently passed, and demands free and unlimited

soinage of silver. Fourth-Demands the passage of laws prohibiting the alien ownership of land, and that congress taky prompt action to devise some plan to obtain all lands now owned by alieus and foreign syndicates, and that all lands held by railroads and other corpora tions in excess of what is actually needed by them be reclaimed and held for actual set-

Fifth-Believing in the doctrine of equal rights to all and special privileges to none, we demand that our national legislation be so framed in the future as not to build up one industry at the expense of another. We further demand the removal of the existing heavy tariff from the necessaries of life that the poor of our land must have. We further demand a just and equitable system of gradunted taxation on incomes. We believe the noney of the country should be kept as nuch as possible in the hands of our people, and demand that all national and state revenues be limited to the necessary expenses of the government, economically and honestly

Sixth-We demand the most rigid, honest and just state and national control and supervision of the means of public communication and transportation, and if this does not remove the abuses now existing, we demand the government ownership of such means of communication and transportation.
