An Occupation for Athletic Women. One of the new occupations for women now creating a demand for which the supply is unequal is that of instructors in women's gymnasiums. The salary ranges from \$500 to \$750 a year, with four months' vacation, and the work is most hygienic and improving, but leading manufacturers of gymnasium supplies are unable to fill the orders that come to them for trained teachers in the use of the apparatus. There are five leading schools for physical education. Boston has a normal school in physical culture, the Adelphi academy has another well known institution, where the student is taught how to fit up a gymnasium and to manufacture apparatus as well as to teach their use. The summer school for teachers at Harvard college is an important institution, having had 160 pupils in the three months of its existence. The average cost of instruction in these training colleges is about \$200 a year, and a course of instruction for graduation comprises two years of seven months each.—New York Letter.
