An Indecert.

A dispatch from South Dakota on the night following the election of Kyle says: Senator Kyle defines his position and political tendencies in the following remarks made to night before a meeting of the independents and democrats at Pierre: "When two forces acting in opposite directions meet they produce a new force, which continues to move in a direction different from either of the other forces. This new force is called in mechanics a resultant. To night I feel that I am a resultant—formerly a republican, then an independent, and now that I have been elected by both parties I am a resultant of both parties. I am an indecert. I have always been in favor of a new tariff, and about four years ago, when the republican party declared itself in favor of a high tariff, it was too much for me, and I sought a more congenial party, which I found in the democratic party. After the independent party was formed last year I found that its principles were still more congenial. The independent cannot affiliate with the republicans. The republican's ring rule and high tariff have made affiliation impossible."

The democrats claim that Senator Kyle may be counted with them on party issues, and it is believed he has pledged himself to this effect. He acknowledges that he owes his election to the democrats, who voted for him on receiving assurances from Illinois that the alliance would support Palmer or some other democrat. All the party leaders admit that in the future South Dakota will be classed among the doubtful states. The election of Kyle will strengthen the democratic party and weaken the republican party in the state.

Florence Items.

The West, Feb. 27. Mr. Hawkins and family moved to Acme Thursday to take charge of the boarding house at that place. The steam schooner Record will bring about 45 tons of freight from San Francisco for merchants on the river. The lumber for our new church is arriving from the mills, and as soon as the weather permits its building will commence.

P. W. Stevens, one of the owners of many steamers in San Francisco, arrived here last Saturday via Gardiner. Mr. Stevens has ordered the sale of his schooner, the Record, of about 200,000 feet of lumber burden, to come here and return with a load from our mills. As he is a practical steamboat and lumberman, he proposes to take soundings on our bar, and if the weather permits, take a look at our forests of trees, and then he will be able to report facts to his company. It is to such men as Mr. Stevens that we must look for speedy advancement in commercial intercourse with large cities, and it is a duty our citizens owe themselves to show him our country and thus gain a reputation and standing with a company who proposes to help us if we will help ourselves.

Pendleton East Oregonian: Repetta's colt, a handsome filly which will be one year old March 23, is already attaining a reputation. J. I. More, a horse owner of Chicago, writes to Cass Matlock from Walla Walla, where he is stopping, that although he has never seen the colt, he has seen his dam, Repetta, and has heard that his sire, Leon, is a full brother to Patsy Duffy, sired by Leinster. He has been told, also, that the colt is a finely boned, speedy-looking filly, and offers \$2500 for it, delivered at the West Side track, Chicago. This is a good price for a colt not a year old, and speaks well for the sire and dam. Mr. Matlock has decided to decline the offer, however. Mr. Moore initiates that he will offer more if \$2500 is not sufficient, and he also wants a price on Repetta.

ONE OF THE COX'S.—Many people were surprised to hear of the election of A. N. Hamilton to the office of railroad commissioner by the republican legislature. He is a man of moderate intelligence only. He is under indictment by the grand jury of his own county for a felony, and a civil action is pending against him in Union county to recover money alleged to have been illegally obtained by him from that county while he was sheriff. Both these cases were pending against him when he was elected railroad commissioner.—Pendleton E. O.

Salem at her school meeting Monday decided to build a \$13,000 eight room school house. A 5 mill tax was levied. Albany levied a 4 mill tax. Roseburg 11 mills. Grants Pass 8 mills.
