Oregon Weather Bureau.

has prevailed during the week, especially | Phoenix of London, in southern part, where the rainfall amounts to from sixty-two hundredths of an inch to over one inch. In the Willamette valley generally less than one-quarter of an inch of rain fell. Thunder storms accompanied by rain and hall occurr d on the 25th. The temperature for the week averaged five

degrees a day cooler than last week. The previous week having been unusually warm and dry, the changed weather conditions which prevailed this week have proven of great value to crops of all kinds. The soil is again in excellent condition and the growth of vegetation is very marked. Warmer weather is needed to develop head ing of wheat, outs, &c., but the stalk is de veloping well. Spring sown wheat has made excellent progress. General reports indicate the most flattering prospects for the wheat rop throughout this section. Quite a number of correspondents report fruit falling from the trees. Frosts which at the time were not supposed to have injured evidently did considerable damage. Pranes, cherries and peaches were injured. Cherries especially will not prove to be the crop hoped for. Yambill, Clackamas, Linn, Lane, Douglas and Benton counties report these fruit conditions. Curl leaf or yellows observed at Dayton. Clover is blooming. Gardens are doing finely. Potatoes and peas are ripe in Carry county. Strawberries are ripening slowly, owing to cool weather.

EASTERN OREGON. Cooler partly cloudy weather with general rains prevailed since Tuesday; Sunday and Monday were very warm with east winds. The rains were heavier in Union county than in other sections. On the 25th and 26th thunder storms were quite general. On the 26th a south wind of unusual severity was experienced in parts of Gilliam county, especially at Arlington, which did some damage. The rainfall amounted to from .10 to .45 of an inch. South of Blue mountains, especially in Crook and Grant counties, the weather is yet cool and the season back-

The rain was of inestimable benefit and value to the wheat crop. The east winds did some damage in parts of Umatilla, Morrow and Wasco counties. 'The effects of the rain is supposed to offset the damage. The rains have revived the excellent wheat prospects throughout this section. Fruit is well set and is thriving well. Strawberries are becoming plentiful. G neral prospects for crops of all kinds are at the present time most flattering


