DEADWOOD, Or., Nov. 28, 1891. We are sorry to record the death of Thos. Pope, postmaster of this place, a pioneer settler here and one of our most useful and respected citizens, after an illness of five days, from erysipelas. He had been in bed for several years. He was known as a practical christian, and was a soldier in the late war. He was the father of 13 children, 10 of whom are still living; was married twice, his second wife surviving him. He was born Dec. 7, 1825, died Nov. 19, 1891. Mrs. Pope and family have the sympathy of the entire community in their sad bereavement.
