

GOV. PENNOVER'S SAY.

His Opinion of the Pailure of Chi-nese to Register.

Pontland, May 5.—Governor Pennoyer, referring to the failure of Chinese to register, today, says: "The refusal of the Chinese to register was andoubtedly the result of a collusion be-tween the president and the Chinese minister to disregard the law. The citizens of Oregon first learned of this unholy compact from the hieroglyphic proclamation of the Six Companie posted or Chinese wash houses in Astoria. The president has thus be-come responsible for whatever trouble may arise. If he had declared his pur pose to enforce the law there would have been a complete registration. The Chinese minister has apparently dictated the policy of the administration and he was probably not aware of the fact that state governors are not presidential satraps. Articles of impeachment have been preferred against a president for a less offense than Mr. Cleveland's refusal to strictly enforce the exclusion law.

WASHINGTON, May 4.—The text of the order instructing United States officials not to arrest the Chinese wh have not registered telegraphed from the treasury department today is as for TREASURY DEPARTMENT,

WASHINGTON, D. C., May & The time within which the Chines laborers, required by the act of May i 1802, to procure certificates of residence will expire on the 5th day of the preent month, and it is evident from the partial reports made to this department by the collectors of internal enue that in some of the states and territories large numbers of such persons have failed or refused to make appli-cation as required by the law, but until complete reports are received of the names and residences, those who have registered and procured certificates and who are therefor exempt from arrest, cannot be officially known. The off ectors of internal revenue and coller tors of customs and all customs offi-cers of the United States are therefore instructed to refrain from making asrests under the provision of the sixth section of the act approved May 1 1892, entitled "An act to prohibit th coming of Chinese persons into the United States," until further order and instructions from this department.
