Americans could out down their tariff, because high exchange on Europe would offer enormous incidental protection to their industries. Mexico, being on a monetary equality with the United States, would attract American capital and trade and the two countries would grow rapidly. Nine Hundred Students Protest.

TERRE HAUTE, Ind., June 19.—Nine hundred of the 1000 students of both sexes at the Indiana State Normal School who are protesting against the removal of Prof. Arnold Tompkins from the faculty met in the assembly room of the school this afternoon just after the school day had closed and resolved themselves into a mass meeting to denounce the action of the trusees and President Parsons in causing Prof. Tompkins' removal. Resolutions were presented from the students' committee of 15 asking the trustees to investigate the alleged charge of dis-loyalty against Prof. Tompkins and criticising the course pursued of summarily removing without giving him a chance to defend himself. The resolutions boldly asserted that the socie ty is weak in several places, and that it needs reorganizing and paid a high resolution to Prof. Tompkins. The resolutions also demand that the law be changed so that one of the trustees shall be a student. The resolutions were adopted by a rising vote, only five students voting in the negative.
