News from Many Different Quarters.

Senator Vest in an able article in the August number of the North American Review condemns the Sherman act, but says the friends of silver will not allow it to be made a stalking horse by monometallists.

Free Silver Campaign. WASHINGTON, Aug. 9.—The free silver coinage caucus was attended by about 50 members of congress. The discussion developed that the ratio of 30 to 1 would be acceptable to those who felt that the old ratio should be changed.

No Business in the Senate. WASHINGTON, Aug. 9.—The senate met, and without transacting any business adjourned till tomorrow, on motion of Sherman.

Earthquake Shock in California. SANTA ROSA, Cal. Aug. 9.—The severest earthquake felt here since 1868 occurred this morning at 1:12 o'clock.

San Francisco, Aug. 9.—A sharp shock of earthquake was felt in this city at 1:10 a. m. It was also experienced at Oakland and Sacramento.

New York, Aug. 9.—In hope, stocks are pretty well controlled, and the market is fairly firm, but the trade is light, and export interest quiet.

Will be Withdrawn.—The local trail between Albany and Portland, known as the "Albany local" will be discontinued temporarily after August 15th.

The fourth day—Wednesday. Dates between January 1, and February 28, in leap years, both inclusive, must have 1 subtracted to balance the 1 added by the even division of the year, which is not yet offset by February 29.
