

THE LONGEST SPEECH ON RECORD.

The late effort of "the gentleman from Nebraska," at long-winded speechmaking has again raised the question as to possibilities in that line as well as to the results of previous attempts.

When De Comos defended the settlers' land bill in the lower house of the British Columbian Parliament at Victoria he talked continually for 26 hours.
