THE NEW TARIFF BILL. Free List Will Satisfy the Most Radical.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 27.—The new democratic tariff bill is given out. Its provisions fulfill every expectation of those who predicted it would be a measure of radical reform. In many respects it is a surprise even to demagogues, as it is unprecedented in many provisions.

The duty on alcoholic perfumery at two dollars per gallon, is 25 per cent; blocking 20 per cent; glycerine, crude, one cent per pound, refined 5 cents per pound; ink powder, printers ink 29 per cent; soap, soft, extract of licium, opium 25 per cent; opium containing less than nine per cent of morphine, and opium prepared for smoking, six dollars per pound.
