LINN COUNTY SUGAR CANE.—Corvalis Times; At S. N. Wilkins' furniture stors are to be seen samples of sugar cane grown on the farm of Hensugar cane grown on the farm of HenMcEllengre over in the vicinity of the Phil Miller's market, and upon killsugar cane grown on the farm of Henry McElmurry over in the vicinity of Tangent. The seed came from Aritansas and was planted late in May. The samples are over seven feet in height, well matured and thrifty, and the juicy pith has the genuine Louisana sugar cane taste, both in swextness and flavor. A sample of the growth will be submitted to the experiment station for test. McElmurry is convinced that sugar cane can be grown in Webfoot, and will try the experiment over again next year.
