A phenomena happened a few days ago at the Bonanza mine in Baker county. From Mr. Geiser, superintendent of the property, it is learned that when the ledge was struck in the long tunnel a flow of water equal to 100 inches or more commenced flowing and continued for several hours driving the miners from their work. When it all stopped it was learned that all of the springs at the base of the mountain, 150 feet below, and from which a supply of water for drinking and other purposes were obtained had gone dry.
