The allotment for Oregon from the appropriation for public surveys for the fiscal year is \$10,000.

The December bulletin of the National Association of Wool Manufacturers, in its annual estimate of the wool clip of the United States for 1894, shows that Oregon had on January 1st, 2,529,750 sheep and on April 1st, 2,482,694; 19,853,552 pounds of washed and unwashed wool, the average weight being 8 pounds to the fleece.

At the close of the fiscal year, June 30, 1894, the number of persons upon the pension rolls of the United States, was almost 1,900,000. The precise figures are 969,544. This makes a pensioner of nearly one of every 70 inhabitants of the United States.
