SCHOOL BOOKS.

The wisdom and farightedness of our school superintendents adhering to our best educational interests, to economic principles and to the unbiased desires of their constituents cannot but be commended. The strenuous efforts which were made by those who had the greed and desire for financial gain, availed nothing when brought to bear on such officials as these. It would have been the height of folly, even more than that, to have entailed upon our people at this time, the useless extra expense that would have been incumbent with the change. Besides this cost of the new books, in subject matter, were inferior to the ones now in use, and the binding, etc., of some were such as to call out continued apologies from their representatives. Our people concur most heartily with the superintendents in their wise decision.

WHEAT FED HOGS.

The Armour Packing Company has made a test of wheat fed hogs which gives an advantage of 26 per cent to those thus fed, also that the flavor is as good if not better than those fed on corn. The report goes on to say: "If breeders can produce through wheat-feeding an animal which is profitable to them in the comparative cost of food, and attractive to the packer at the same time, there can be no question about the future of the wheat-fed hog, when wheat is cheap. He has simply come to stay."

Prof. Van Slyke, chemist for the New York Agricultural experiment station, is authority for the statement that we know nothing whatever of the composition of the natural coloring matter in butter. Whatever they may be, they are mixed or united with the fats so as to defy detection. So far as chemists have been able to find out, none of the several compounds of which milk and butter are composed is of any hue except pure white, so that the coloring cannot be a natural part of the fat. Some have suggested that the color in butter is due to the shape and size of the fat globules, in other words, that light is the main factor in color development.

New York Sun: The subject of improvement of county roads is one that is attracting wide-spread attention. The fact exists that our highways in the rural districts are as a general rule, in an unsatisfactory condition, most of them being almost impassable, as well as being of great discomfort during a large portion of the year, and few are kept in a proper state of repair. They are far inferior to those throughout England and several other countries in the New England states are conspicuously better than ours.

In writing up the vote of the school book question, the Salem Statesman says: The all important question to be answered at present, more especially for the benefit of the general public, is, "What book company is benefited thereby" and the answer is, "The American Book Company." Instead of it controlling about 95 per cent. of the book sales as at present it will in a few months have the entire control, or as a prominent educator said yesterday, "it will come near handling 100 per cent of the sales."

The Eugene council acted wisely in giving assurance that right of way would be granted the box and basket factory men for a switch to their yards. Factories must be had by our town, and just as certainly must all just concessions be made to them. The soliciting committee is still out, and it is the duty of every citizen to hunt up the committee and subscribe something and do it at once.

Pendleton E. O., Senator Dolph has arrived from Washington, and the Oregonian says he expects to remain some little time. Yes, until the legislature re-elected or does not re-elect him. The senator is a little "nervous" over the outcome; but since he has bargained and paid for his re-election, it would not be right to disappoint him.

A Creamery.

It is a very strange thing to us that the Oregon people of this section of the state are slow to take up with the creamery business. It is more strange because it will redound greatly to their financial gain, and if for no other reason than that it should receive the support of all our people and a first-class creamery be established in this immediate neighborhood.

In a conversation with Mr. H. Hutchinson, of Goshen, the other day, he informed us that a visit to his brother, who lives in the Kittitas valley, Washington, was what convinced him that such a business will do more than any other to put a more steady flow of the circulating medium in the section of country in which such an enterprise is started. The proprietors of the creamery in that valley would take the milk from the farmer, extract the cream and return the remainder to the farmer and charge a percentage on the butter made. Mr. Hutchinson's brother informed him that he not only got more butter from the same amount of milk, but that, as creamery butter, it always brought a difference in price more than make up the percentage charged by the creamery man for making it. In addition to this the creamery man furnished the market also, so that the farmer was left with simply his stock to take care of, and by caring in buying and in careful testing was enabled as experience gave them familiarity with the work to make even a greater profit in addition to the other products of the farm.

Talks with other persons who formerly lived in dairying districts and add truth to this statement and they still remain why not start a creamery in this section? It is not necessary to have this enterprise started by outside parties, as it seems that very few desire it, but let a joint stock company be started here, or let it be run on a cooperative plan—in short, in any way so that we have a creamery in our midst. Until one is started, however, few will realize its necessity.
