

Whimberry Items.

Feed is good and stock getting fat. The creek is getting very low and fish are biting fine.

Bob Young who took some cattle up to the deadings Wednesday says he caught 40 fine trout out of the north fork of the creek inside of an hour.

The school house is now completed, much to the credit of Samuel McBees who supervised the work and in fact did a great deal of it himself.

Our first school commenced today, Mrs. Mary Harkins Klasinger being the teacher.

Geo. Young will soon leave us to assist Mr. Russell in taking a drove of cattle to Idaho. We hope he will soon return.

The planting of gardens, that kept all but the loggers here busy for the last six weeks is now about done, and chittim and tan bark peeling will now be the order of the day.

Of the 1805 sawlogs that were cut on Whimberry this spring about 600 remain near the mouth of the creek on account of low water, while the rest mixed in the Fall Creek run are now in the river en route for Eugene, where they will arrive inside of about two weeks.

Burial of Gottlieb Reinmann.

Gottlieb Reinmann the drowned boy, born in South Dakota May 18th, 1883, drowned on the 25th of March 1895, was taken out of the river by the hands of his father and others, May 18. Descended to the grave in Gillespie's cemetery the same day 5 o'clock p. m., in the presence of his father, mother, brethren and sisters, and a respectable number of neighbors and friends.

Whereas the boy was preliminarily instructed from the catechism, and from the lips of his parents and pastor concerning the Christian religion, namely, the decalogue, creed, Lord's Supper, Lord's Prayer, and baptism.

He understood to a certain degree, the efficacy of the Redeemer's resurrection. Knew through and by faith that it is sown in corruption, raised in incorruption; sown in dishonor raised in glory; sown in weakness, raised in power (1 Cor; 15: 42, 43.)

And when this corruptible shall have put on incorruption and this mortal shall have put on immortality, then shall he be brought to pass the saying, (James, 2: 8) "He will swallow up death in victory." These promises were quoted and considered to be the divine consolation to the afflicted and mourning parents and to all whom it may concern.

WILL SHIP 500 HEAD.—John Stewart will make his third shipment of cattle from this section the 25th or 30th inst. This shipment will consist of 500 head of cows and calves, and will be consigned to the Burke Land and Cattle Company of Idaho, the same firm to whom the last shipment was made.

About 300 head of these cattle were purchased in the vicinity of Roseburg, and will be driven to Eugene, arriving here about Tuesday of next week. The remainder have been purchased in the valley. In addition to this shipment Mr Stewart has another contract for 500 head of steers which he will drive across the mountains, delivering them at Squaw Creek. The Burke Land and Cattle Company have a contract with the United States government to furnish 3000 head of cattle which the government will distribute among the Indians of the reservations of the Northwest. A large number of these cattle are being purchased in Oregon.

REV. T. L. JONES HURT.—Rev. T. L. Jones was badly hurt in a runaway accident at Grants Pass, Thursday. He had accompanied his family, who are moving to their new home in that county, one day's drive and had reached the saw and door factory in town on his return when his team became frightened, and a bridge broke leaving nothing with which to control them. Finally the horses were brought up suddenly in a clump of oak trees, and Mr Jones was thrown violently forward about twenty-five feet. Dr Van Dyke attended Mr Jones, who complains of pains in his chest and back as a result of the accident.
