CHRISTIAN ENDEAVOR SERVICES.

An Address by Dr. Francis E. Clark, Father of the C. E. Movement. Daily Guard, May 23. It was through the untiring efforts of Mrs. R. McMurphy that Dr. Francis E. Clark, organizer of the first Christian Endeavor society in the world, was prevailed upon to visit Eugene and deliver an address to Christian Endeavorers of our city, and when it was announced that he, in company with State President H. S. Gile, of Salem, would speak at the M. E. church last evening, everybody, whether Christian Endeavorer or not, made up their mind to attend and hear this noted man, whose mind first conceived the idea of organizing together a little band of youthful Christian workers in church of which he was then pastor in Williston, Maine, a little over four years ago, and from which has sprung forth a movement which has rapidly become popular and useful and spread into every land on the globe, multiplying until its societies now number far up into the thousands with a membership in the millions.

It was a fortunate schedule of train hours which permitted Dr. Clark to stop in Eugene. He has been traveling through the West attending state conventions of the C. E., having recently been present at Oregon's convention at Salem and being now on his way to California from Washington. Dr. Clark arrived here on the local train at 2:30 yesterday afternoon, remaining until 12 o'clock last night when he resumed his journey south.

Last evening long before the hour for opening the program had arrived the large auditorium of the M. E. church was filled with people and hundreds of others were crowding into the galleries and class rooms, which had been thrown open. The services were opened by singing a number of hymns and an anthem. Mrs. Linn had charge of the music and the singers were selected from the choir of the city. The music furnished one of the most excellent features of the program throughout. Miss Nettie Chase, president of the city union, presided over the meeting and first introduced Rev. H. F. Gile, who, welcomed Dr. Clark as a few patriotic words in behalf of the Christian Endeavorers. Mayor Matlock was next introduced and bade Dr. Clark a hearty welcome in behalf of our fair city. State President H. S. Gile was introduced and made a few remarks in regard to the state work; also stating that it was the earnest desire of Oregon to secure the international convention at Portland in 1907, and requested all endeavors to work to that end.

By this time the large assemblage of people had been aroused to the highest pitch of expectancy and when Father Endeavor Clark was introduced to a Eugene audience for the first, and in all probability the last time, he was greeted by loud cheering and with a brief sketch of his work being done by Christian Endeavorers throughout the world. Some of his audience doubtless expected to hear the history of that first infant society, which was born away back in Williston church, fourteen years ago, but Dr. Clark did not choose to tell them that. Instead, he took his audience with him and selling out through Golden Gate, was on his journey through the world, touching along the principal islands of the Pacific and traveling across the Eastern Hemisphere, everywhere, in every land and among every people, meeting Christian Endeavorers, and by his interesting and touching descriptions, bringing his audience into closer touch with the land of his work.
