Archbishop Kenrick Still in Possession

Rome, June 6 .- It is stated at the vatican that the brief cable from St. Louis announcing the pope's deposition of Archbishop Kenrick and nomination in his stead of Archbishop Kain, is due to an unfortunate misapprehension of a cable from Rome, which summarized the action taken by the congregation of the propaganda. The written decree was mailed to the United States several days ago. It does not depose Archbishop Kenrick from his present title or position nor appoint Archbishop Kain his successor. Such action could only have been taken through a papal bull. The present action is the decree of the congregation made for the purpose of assisting in the management of the administration of the church propbeen given a new title as archbishop of a suppressed diocese in the far East, in order that the change would entail no sacrifice of dignity or station, but the decree Rade no change in his title and leaves him in possession of his present title as arch shop of St. Louis.
