WANT \$50,000.—Corvallis Times:

Jack Mayo and 180 other employes of the O. P. R. R. who a year ago petitioned the court for an order asking that the Farmers Trust & Loan Co. be required to pay into the court the balance due them as employes of the O. P. during the Hayley receivership, a demurrer to which was sustained by Judge Fulington, have appealed. The petition of Mayo et al. is based on the legal proposition that the plaintiff in a suit is responsible for the costs, and they sought to have the court declare that the railroad being in the hands of the court, indebtedness to employes incurred in the operation of the road were legitimate court expenses or costs, and that therefore, the plaintiff, the Farmers Trust & Loan Co., should be made to pay them. The aggregate of the sum the petitioners asked to have the plaintiff pay into court was about \$50,000.

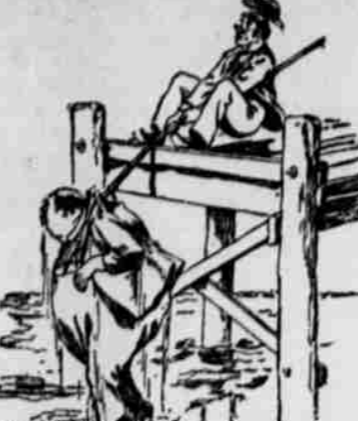
