THE REGENTS MEET.

Professor of Music Elected—New Apparatus Ordered, Etc. The Board of Regents of the University of Oregon held a meeting in this city this morning and transacted the following items of business:

Died.

John Harper, an old man, was stricken with paralysis at the county poor farm Tuesday afternoon and yesterday died from the effects of the stroke.

THE COUNTY PROTECTED.

On May 29th, 1895 John Harper, the deceased, died to the county 131.55 acres in T2, S2 E, on the following conditions: Conveyance is made with the understanding, that Lane county shall care for and keep as other county charges, the said John Harper at the expense of the county during his lifetime and to recover the said described premises to the said John Harper or his heirs and assigns if demanded within three years or during the lifetime of said John Harper upon filing by said party a good and sufficient bond to Lane county for the proper care and keeping of the said John Harper during his natural life and the repayment to the said Lane county with legal interest for all expenses incurred by the said county in the care and keeping of said John Harper.

GAME WARDEN HELD UP.

The Larimer Brothers, Charged With Killing Deer, Resist Arrest. Daily Guard, September 6.

As previously stated in the GUARD, Deputy Game Warden McClanahan left for the upper Willamette yesterday morning with warrants for the arrest of W H, J C and V Larimer, brothers, and S B Larimer, father of the brothers, all of whom were charged with killing deer out of season.

The Larimers live about 30 miles up the Willamette, southeast of Eugene. They live across the river from the military road and the Deputy Game Warden McClanahan in company with Duncan Scott, whom he had summoned to assist him, reached a point opposite the Larimer residence last evening.

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Arriving here, the brother they had arrested, Wm Larimer, was taken before Justice Wheeler and placed under \$100 bonds which he furnished, Wm Goodman going his bail.
