

Atmospheric Pressure. The science of atmospheric pressures has been the subject of various and valuable experiments by Professor Ashman at Charlottenburg, near Berlin. Recently there was sent up a small balloon provided with improved automatic registering apparatus designed to reproduce automatic-ally the figures indicated by the barometer and thermometer at various heights. The balloon, it is related, first started off in a northeast direction, voored suddenly to the northeast and finally landed in good condition in the district of Zvornik, on the Servo-Bosnian frontier, after a voyage of 11 hours, and, since the distance between the two points is about 600 milles, the vo locity of the balloon was, without count ing curves, nearly 60 miles an hour.
