TRUE BILL REPORTED.

Two of the Hobos Held by the Grand Jury to Answer to Two Counts. Daily Guard, June 11. The grand jury hung fire yesterday in the consideration of the hobos arrested on the charge of sodomy, but when they took up the case and to the satisfaction of the public which desires to see the law enforced to the fullest extent of its power in this matter, soon returned a true bill charging two of the hobos, John Foster and John Martin, with two counts. The first count is the crime of sodomy and the second is assault with intent to rob. Attorney N. E. Markley was appointed by Judge Fullerton to defend the criminals. The defendants both entered pleas of not guilty to both charges when arraigned in circuit court. A jury trial was called at 3 o'clock and is now in progress at the court house. The penalty for the crime of sodomy, if committed, is from 1 to 5 years in the penitentiary. If an attempt is made to commit the crime and the person attempting it fail to accomplish their purpose by reason of interruption caused by fear of detection, the penalty shall be one-half of the highest penalty had the crime actually been committed, which would be 2 1/2 years in the penitentiary. The penalty for the crime of assault with intent to rob is imprisonment of not less than 1 or more than 10 years in the penitentiary.
