

HOPS NOW CLIMBING.

Price Gone Up to Eleven Cenis and Still Golug.

Still Going. The hop market of '96 is a most pecu-liar one, and is as much of a surprise to brewers and dealers as growers, says the Oregon City Press. Six weeks ago 50,000 bales could have been secured in Oregon at 5 to 6 cents, but the brewers refused to advance picking money and hops were left unpicked. The same same thing happened in Washington, California and New York, resulting in the American crop being reduced to about 170,000 bales or 100,000 bales short of a full crop. The amount re-quired for home consumption is 200,000 bales, which leaves an apparent short-age, but here is where the olds and old-olds must be figured in, and they are variously estimated at from 35,000 to 100,000 bales. England's crop is estimated at 350,-000, which is 150,000 bales short of her requirements and 30,000 short of her
