order at 10 o'clock by Speaker Davis  
and skirmishing immediately began.  
Speaker directed clerk to call roll but  
Somers demanded call of house, which  
is practically the same thing.

U'Ren wanted floor to make examination

and Bilyeu insisted on point of order  
that proceedings were out of order.  
Speaker finally directed clerk to pro-  
ceed with roll call. Roll call showed  
29 members present.
