SHALL ATTEND SCHOOL.

An Excellent Law That Should be Strictly Entorced.

The State Superintendent Insists that this part of the school law most be rigidly enfinced:

D E Yoran returned from Portland ian or other person in this state having Section 65. Every parent, guardcontrol or charge of a child or children Mrs M L Washburn spent today in between the ages of 8 and 1 years shall be required to send such shad or children to a public school at set twelve weeks in every selioni year of which at least eight weeks encol shall be consecutive, unless the bodily or magnal condition of such child or children has been such his or her or their attendance at school or application to study for the period required, or unless such child or children are taught in a private school, or at home in such branches as one usually taught in the public schools; provided, in case a public achool shall not be taught for the period of tweive weeks, or any part thereof during the year, within two miles by the nearest traveled road of the residence of any preson within the school district, he of she shall got be liable to the provisions of this act.

"Section on Any parent guardian or other person having control or charge of any child or children failing to comply with the provisions of this act shall be liable to a fine of not less than \$5 nor more than \$25 for the first offence, nor less than \$25 nor more than \$50 for the second and each subsequent offence, besides the cost of prosecution. "Section 67. It shall be the duty

of the directors and clerk of each school district to make diligent effort to see that this law is enforced in their respective districts. "Section 68, Justices of the peace

shall have concurrent jurisdiction with the elicult court in all pro ceutions under this act."
