MONDAY, JULY 5

ENDEAVOR TRAIN.

Passed Through Eugene This Morning

Bound for San Francisco.

DAILY, 6 A.M., July 5.

About 9:30 o'clock this morning the

Ore. on C E special train, bound for

the international convention at San

Francisco arrived in Eugene, stayed 10

minutes, taking on two more coaches

and then pulled out for the Bay city.

The cars were profusely decorated with the Endeavor colors of Oregon,

white and gold, and with "C E,"

monogram, which is now so well

known everywhere. On the top of the

coaches the flags of the international

convention were placed. Three coaches

comfortably filled, and a baggage car

comprised the train on its arrival at this

city, the addition of the two coaches

here making a neat-sized excursion

train. Dave Houston the well known

conductor is chaperoning the party

through. The train will stop over

night in Ashland and proceed on

through the next day. Those going from

Hendricks, Mary McMurphy, Vesta Drake,

D Needy. Many prominent Endeavor

ers from points below were noted

among whom were State Senator J E

Haselton and daughter of Portland,

Salem. Luncheons were prepared for

the crowd by the Eugene societies and

distributed while the train remained here.
