Crop failures have been reported, consequently the price of wheat goes up. - There is not enough to meet the demand and bidding sends up the price, Wool, cotton, hops and other commerce respond very quick ly when either a shortage or surplus is reported.

During the past two years men have been , uncertain as to the future, and much money has been locked up from investment. 
